COMPREHENSIVE NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Dr. Johnson provided information about the CNA process using the PowerPoint presentation provided as a handout in OneNote. The goal for this committee is to start this process early and set priorities for the District Improvement Plan. This process is a state requirement because the district receives Title funds.

- The CNA surveys end on January 19th.
- Paper copies for parents will be available at the last Parent University scheduled for January 18th.
- This process requires the examination of several sources of data, some trend such as PEIMS and discipline.
- Evidence based decisions to support facts.

The 5 Step Process

- Are we revising the current District Improvement Plan (DIP)? We want to make sure we help our students move forward.
- What do we want to accomplish with this process? This is a process and not an event.
- How to get multiple stakeholders involved?
- How will we share the purpose and outcome with those involved?
- How will team members be selected and how to ensure diversity? What is their expertise?
- How to maintain confidentiality of student data? Of survey open-ended responses?
- Do not jump to assumptions while viewing data but go through the process.
- Determine areas of needs and summarize priorities.
 - What evidence supports this?
 - Things listed as a priority must first be listed as a need.
 - Limit priorities to approximately two or three.
 - Will these identified needs and priorities lead to improvement in student achievement?
- How does CNA survey data relate to the DIP?
- How do priorities and needs correlate with justifying federal and local fund expenditures?
- How to get parents and family members involved with the student's education?
 - Assistance with homework, parent conferences, parent involvement on campus.
- Dr. Johnson provided a summary of how the process will proceed beginning with next month's meeting.
